Happy New Year to you all and I hope you were able to enjoy a safe and relaxing festive period. The issue of speeding vehicles is regularly raised at our Engagement meetings and in response to these concerns my Safer Neighbourhood Team, working with our local Special Constabulary Officers have put together a new initiative for 2019 forming a local team trained to deal with speeding complaints. They will work with and compliment the excellent work already being carried out by our Community Speed Watch schemes. You can follow their progress and where they have been on our Twitter social media page @BrecklandPolice - #DriveSafe. They already have a list of areas to start work on from me! We are currently very fortunate to have 9 local Community Speedwatch Teams, with another 3 in the process of being formed. These teams of volunteers work closely with Police and are instrumental in reducing speeding vehicles in their villages. Your Safer Neighbourhood, Special Constabulary and local Response officers have had another very busy month. As well enjoying the opportunity to enjoy the festive atmosphere at the Dereham Christmas Light Switch on event, they haven't stopped proactively policing the Dereham and wider parish areas and progressing work on the current Safer Neighbourhood Priorities. Two males have been arrested on suspicion of possessing Class A and Class B drugs following a vehicle stop on Norwich Road Dereham. 2 Vehicles were seized under Section 59 Police Reform Act for anti-social driving and enquiries are continuing with regard a driver stopped in the Shipdham for the offences of driving without a licence or insurance following reports of anti-social behaviour in the area.

Crime Update (December 2018)

Crime Statistics are provided for the preceding month of **December 2018**. The data relates to the cluster of Parishes as detailed overleaf. Further statistical data (including offences & location detail) can be obtained from www.police.co.uk

Offence	Numbers	What This Could Entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	1	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary Residential	0	Residential Burglary will encompass entry to any building within the curtilage/ boundary of a residence, e.g. garden sheds and garages
Burglary Business and Community	0	Business and community Burglaries will include shops, businesses and other property. In general, the purpose for which a building is designed will determine whether it should be classified as 'Residential' or 'Business and Community'.
Criminal Damage	2	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	4	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	1	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	0	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	1	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
